



Former IBM-GTS/TSS Division Employees Eligible To Apply for Trade Act Benefits

WETHERSFIELD, May 3, 2017 – Former employees of IBM-GTS/TSS Division in Southbury, who provided global sales support services, were certified on April 13, 2017 as eligible to apply for federal Trade Adjustment Assistance.

The Connecticut Labor Department is mailing an eligibility notice regarding the benefits to all affected employees and is providing information on how to apply for them. The former employees eligible to apply for federal benefits are those who are or will be totally or partially separated from employment due to lack of work on or after March 2, 2016 and on or before April 13, 2019.

Available assistance may include training, income support in the form of Trade Readjustment Allowances (TRA), and job search and relocation allowances for qualified workers who seek or obtain employment outside their normal commuting areas. Individuals 50 years of age and older who return to lower-paying work may be eligible to receive Reemployment Trade Adjustment Assistance (RTAA) wage subsidies.

Workers who believe they may qualify, yet do not receive eligibility information, are urged to contact their nearest *American Job Center* for information and assistance. Those who need to apply for unemployment benefits are reminded that new and continued claims can be filed online at www.FileCTUI.com.
